## Back to School Shoe Drop

Sonya Adamson is a PCPC employee who is charged with taking care of our young people during Worship Service on Sundays. She is also a foster mom to two children, a little boy and girl.

It takes a special person to foster children, particularly very young kids. You can imagine the questions and concerns they bring with them to their new home. How long will we be there? Who will take care of us? Will they like me?

When the children were delivered to Sonya's care they came with only the clothes they were wearing. And, the clothes they were wearing were too small. They had no other belongings.

Think about your own kids. Imagine they had only the clothes on their backs. No books. No toys. No PJs. No toothbrush. No fresh underwear. No clean bedding. Nothing.

That is a huge responsibility for both foster parents and the families involved.

The great news is that there is a local non profit organization, known as "The Vault" that helps families entering the foster system with these basic expenses. They are always looking for donations of goods and volunteers.

Our Session was inspired by Sonya and her family and have agreed to participate in a

Back To School Shoe Drop to provide new shoes for each of some 20 area kids who are living in the foster system - maybe the first new shoes the kids have ever had.

Next week,we'll get a list of the kids identified by age and shoe size and you can select one of them to purchase new closed-toe play and school shoes. Insert in the shoe box a letter of encouragement and bring them to church by July 18th. We'll deliver them to The Vault during the week of July 18 - 24. Picture these tiny kiddos proudly walking into school on the first day with their new shoes!

# Why do we need foster care in Texas?

- We need foster care due to the ever increasing number of abused and neglected children needing homes.
- There are over 10,000 Texas children waiting for foster and/or adoptive homes.
- In 2011 in Bexar County, there were 17,000 investigations of reported child abuse; 9000 of these were for neglect. Last year half of the fatalities of children were linked to neglect.
- When foster homes are not found, these children are having to stay at Child Protective Services (CPS) offices on cots, and/or siblings are being split up and placed in separate foster homes or in residential treatment centers (RTC's).
- In Bexar County and the surrounding counties, there were 1188 children adopted last year.
